ESTIMATED COST OF PROJECT: Includes the cost of construction and a 5% contingency This does not include the cost of kitchen or parking lot. These will be funded separately.	\$1,100,000
CASH ON HAND: Includes pledges collected and designated building funds, mortgage reserve and capital improvement.	\$717,000


On November 10th Pastor Gary Heltsley will be presiding as Leah and I will be on vacation in Israel . We will return on November 15th.



From The Secretary's Table by Judy Clark

Cooler weather is upon us and it's time to bring out the comfort foods! This makes a lot! We used half a recipe.

DOUBLE-CHEESE MACARONI Prep: 25min Bake: 20 min

1 pkg (16 oz) elbow macaroni

3 C (24oz) 4% cottage cheese

1/2 C butter, cubed

1 tsp salt

1 C milk

TOPPING:

1/2 C all-purpose flour

3 C half-and-half cream

1 C dry bread crumbs

1/4 C butter, melted

1/2 tsp white pepper

1/4 tsp garlic salt

Cook macaroni according to package directions. Meanwhile, place cottage cheese in a food processor; cover and process until smooth. Set aside. In a large saucepan, melt butter. Stir in the flour, salt, pepper and garlic salt (I used garlic powder) until smooth. Gradually add cream and milk. Bring to a boil; cook and stir for 2 minutes or until thickened. Drain Macaroni, transfer to a large bowl. Add the cheddar cheese, cottage cheese and white sauce, toss to coat. Transfer to a greased 9"x13" baking dish. (Dish will be full.) Combine bread crumbs and butter; 4 C (16 oz) shredded cheddar cheese sprinkle over the top. Bake uncovered, at 400 degrees for 20 - 25 minutes or until bubbly. (I stirred the cheddar cheese into the white sauce in the pan, until

melted. I then added the cottage cheese and stirred that together. I ended with the macaroni, which was then easy to fold in.)
