#### Reformation and The Lutheran Rose



The most enduring symbol of the Lutheran Reformation is the seal that Luther himself designed to represent his theology. By the early 1520s, this seal begins to appear on the title page of Luther's works.

Here is how Luther himself explained its meaning\*

First, there is a *black cross* in a *heart* that remains its natural color. This is to remind me that it is faith in the Crucified One that saves us. Anyone who believes from the heart will be justified (Romans 10:10). It is a black cross, which mortifies and causes pain, but it leaves the heart its natural color....

The heart should stand in the middle of a *white rose*. This is to show that faith gives joy, comfort, and peace—it puts the believer into a white, joyous rose....

This rose should stand in a *sky-blue field*, symbolizing that a joyful spirit and faith is a beginning of heavenly, future joy, which begins now, but is grasped in hope, not yet fully revealed.

Around the field of blue is a *golden ring* to symbolize that blessedness in heaven lasts forever and has no end....

#### From The Secretary's Table by Judy Clark

#### **ASIAN-STYLE SHRIMP FRITTATA**

Prep time: 10 min Cook: 20 min

1/4 C soy sauce

2 T sugar

2 T extra virgin olive oil (EVOO)

2 C white mushrooms (about 8 oz) thinly sliced

1/2 bunch asparagus (about 8 oz), trimmed and cut into 1-inch pieces

1/4 lb frozen peeled & deveined large shrimp, thawed and chopped

4 scallions, chopped

1 C mung bean sprouts

8 eggs, beaten

salt & pepper

- 1. In a small saucepan, whisk together 1/4 C water, the soy sauce and sugar over high heat. Bring to a boil and cook until reduced to a syrup, about 5 minutes (you should have about 3 T).
- 2. In a large nonstick skillet, heat the EVOO over medium-high heat. Add the mushrooms and asparagus and cook until vegetables are tender, about 5 minutes. Stir in the shrimp, scallions and bean sprouts and cook for 2-3 minutes.
- 3. Season the eggs with salt and pepper and pour over the mixture. Cook, pulling back the edges and tipping the pan to let the uncooked eggs flow underneath, until the eggs are set, about 5 minutes. Cover and let stand for 3 minutes. Drizzle the soy mixture on top and serve.
