#### PSALM 121 OUR JOURNEY WITH JESUS

<sup>1</sup> I lift up my eyes to the hills. From where does my help come? <sup>2</sup> My help comes from the Lord, who made heaven and earth. <sup>3</sup> He will not let your foot be moved; he who keeps you will not slumber. <sup>4</sup> Behold, he who keeps Israel will neither slumber nor sleep. <sup>5</sup> The Lord is your keeper; the Lord is your shade on your right hand. <sup>6</sup> The sun shall not strike you by day, nor the moon by night.



<sup>7</sup> The Lord will keep you from all evil; he will keep your life. <sup>8</sup> The Lord will keep your going out and your coming in from this time forth and forevermore.

When I was in the emergency room at Harrison Hospital, just before they... put me to sleep... I recited this Psalm. When I woke up the nurse told me I was saying it when I went to sleep AND when I woke up. She said, "It made me cry." It's my favorite Psalm and the background is this:

When people walk or march together, they often sing or chant familiar lines. This often helps to set the rhythm or pace of the walk. Sometimes it helps the travelers stay focused on the journey's end, especially when the song or lines speak about what awaits them.

This is the case with Psalm 121. It was spoken by pilgrims as they made their way up to Jerusalem.

The holy city sits on top of one of the highest points in Israel. The temple, where the worship, praise, and sacrifices took place, was in Jerusalem and was also called Mount Zion. As people journeyed up to the temple, their eyes were drawn to the long climb ahead of them. They said this Psalm as a prayer, that God would protect them on their journey, and they used this time to prepare their hearts for God.

Spiritually, we also have a hard, difficult journey. Because of sin, we are weak and unable to walk the wearisome way. God knew, however, that the climb was too much for us, so He came down to us. He then climbed the rough road that went up the hill to the cross. We now journey with Jesus, knowing that our help has come. It came from the hills, the hill of Calvary.

Dear Jesus, thank You for traveling the road of sorrow to take away our sins. Fix our eyes always on that one hill where You died, for we know that from that hill comes our help. Help us to walk today knowing that the Guardian of Israel, the Maker of heaven and earth, walks with us. Amen.

## From The Secretary's Table by Judy Clark

Here's a recipe that we recently tried. We both enjoyed it and since summer is almost over, I thought I would share it with you. Enjoy!

#### SUMMER PORK CHOPS

Active: 20 min Serves: 4

- 1/4 C balsamic vinegar
- 1 T honey
- 1 clove garlic, finely chopped
- 1-1/2 tsp. salt, divided
- 1 tsp. freshly ground black pepper, divided
- 6 T olive oil, divided, plus more for grill grates (if using)
- 4 1/2 inch thick bone-in pork chops (about 2 lbs.)
- 4 C arugula (about 4 oz)
- 1 C loosely packed fresh flat-leaf parsley leaves, torn
- 4 ripe peaches, nectarines or apricots, pitted and sliced

**Preheat** grill to high (450 degrees to 500 degrees) and lightly oil grates. Whisk vinegar, honey, garlic, 1/2 tsp each salt and pepper, and 5 T olive oil.

**Pat** pork chops dry and brush with remaining 1 T olive oil. Season both sides with remaining 1 tsp salt and 1/2 tsp pepper. Grill, uncovered, flipping once, until a meat thermometer inserted in thickest portion registers 145 degrees, 3-4 minutes per side. Let rest for 10 minutes.

Meanwhile toss arugula with parsley and peaches. Serve with pork, drizzled with vinaigrette.

(Note: I substituted spring mix for the arugula and I used boneless loin chops)
