The North Bay Lutheran council met via Zoom on December 10th. One piece of business was to accept the Congregational meeting minutes from November 22nd. Amazingly seventy voting members marked their ballots on that day. The proposed 2021 budget was passed and three council members were elected or re-elected. To complete the process, at the meeting Pastor Brian installed the 2021 Council. The NBL slate of officers for 2021 are: Jan Gleich -Treasurer, Carole Boyko - Financial Secretary, Judy Clark - Secretary, Dave Severied - Vice President, and Janet Wright - President.

The council selected January 7th as the date for the Council Retreat (via Zoom). Some of the topics that will be discussed are the Mission of North Bay Lutheran, the purposes of the Ministries and the roles of the Council members.

Guy Bralley keeps us up to date with the progress on the RGHT project. The siding on the church is complete and the gutters will be installed before years end. The wiring, plumbing and HVAC systems are all ready for inspection. The next step will be to install insulation and possibly the elevator. It is very exciting to see such progress.

Have you thought about what needs to happen when the RGHT project is completed?

Everything will need to be pulled from storage, moved back into the building, cleaned and placed and the kitchen committee will be able to manifest their vision. Just as we planned and scheduled to move out of the church, we will be making plans soon to move back in. Your help will be needed. Keep reading the COMPASS newsletter for opportunities to serve.

Welcome 2021! Happy New Year Everyone!

The RGHT Project has been slow moving but is marching toward completion. The first estimate of completion is Easter. With God's help this will be true, however, we may still not be able to meet due to Covid 19. Keep watching for further updates.

Completion prior to the total collection of pledges due June 30, 2021 leaves a problem in the financing of this project. As of December 6, 2020, the total cost of the project is \$1,165,463. This includes all the change orders, the required fire system, \$25,000 for the kitchen (which is considerably bigger than the previous kitchen), and the new sound system requirements. Paid to Date is \$729,927 making the current balance due the contractor \$435,536. Our pledges totaled \$587,982 of which \$471,040 has been collected. This leaves \$116,942 in pledges which are not due until June 30, 2021. Current cash on hand for the RGHT Project is \$175,809.

Here we are six months until the end of our Capital Campaign to remodel our beloved church.

When analyzing these figures, please remember that if the project is totally complete by Easter we may be short a grand total of approximately \$259,727. If the total completion is not until the end of June and all pledges are received, we will be short only \$142,785.

Pledges are being paid regularly each Sunday so the total collected will change little by little with time. We are requesting all pledges be paid as soon as possible!

Unfortunately, the church is still short by a substantial amount. The council is now tasked with ways to cover this deficit but **we need your help!** Sadly, all grants to which we have applied have been declined. At this time, we do not want to take out a loan from a financial institution as it will only increase the amount owed.

One option: Can you see clear to increase your pledges to offset this deficit? It would help and be greatly appreciated! If you do not itemize your deductions and can only take the standard deduction on your tax return, the CARES Act allows for up to a \$300 additional deduction for charitable contributions for 2020. Remember, all pledges must still be paid by June 30, 2021. Contact Carole Boyko, Financial Secretary, if you can help in this way.

Another option: Is it at all possible for one, two or several congregation members to float the church personal loans that will be paid back in a timely manner? Terms are negotiable and interest will be paid. Jan Gleich, Treasurer, is the person to contact if you can help in this way.

The council is so very appreciative of your support for this huge project and do not want to have to ask for additional funds. We do so with humility.

God has led us through this entire journey and we have faith He will present a solution to NBLCC soon.

FROM THE SECRETARY'S TABLE BY JUDY CLARK

APPLE DUMPLINGS

4 apples, cored & peeled - place apples in an 8"x8" baking dish - fill the center of each with: 1/2 C sugar mixed with 1 tsp cinnamon (2 C sugar, 4 tsp cinnamon total)

DUMPLING

1 egg, beaten - add 1/2 C. sugar, 2 T melted butter, 1/2 C flour, a pinch of salt and mix well.

Pour over apples. Add 1/2 C water in the bottom of the pan to prevent scorching.

Bake at 350 degrees for 50 - 60 minutes.
